# **Arrangements for September 2020**

# We're Going Back To School

We are currently in the process of planning for September 2020. As previously stated, we are looking at all pupils and students

returning in September, unless individual clinical or public health advice dictates otherwise. We have been instructed to be clear with parents/carers that children of compulsory school age must be in school unless a statutory reason applies, for example - a leave of absence has been granted, sickness, or a necessary religious observance.

We are following the Government guidance regarding full opening which suggests various measures be put in place in order to minimise the risk of transition of COVID-19. This includes changes to normal school operation, changes to the curriculum and contingency planning in the event of an outbreak. We are in the fortunate position of having a thorough risk assessment already in place, though obviously this will need to be reviewed and updated following current, and any further, guidance.

There will be changes to arrangements for dropping off and picking up children. This will, in line with the guidance, involve staggered start and end times. We will be limiting interactions between individuals, which includes not allowing any visitors on site without prior arrangement, so part of this process will involve children being collected from vehicles.

Within all of this planning, all parents/carers have an important role to play in ensuring that they do not send their children to school if they, or anyone else in the household, are unwell. Also, we are asking that all parents/carers fully engage with the NHS Test and Trace process and that they:

- book a test if they or their child are displaying symptoms pupils/students <u>must not</u> come into school if they have symptoms, and will be sent home to self-isolate if they develop them whilst at school.
- provide details of anyone they, or their child, have been in close contact with if they test positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) or if asked by NHS Test and Trace
- self-isolate if they have been in close contact with someone who develops coronavirus (COVID-19) symptoms or someone who tests positive for coronavirus (COVID-19).

We will be sending out full details of September arrangements towards the end of August. This will include an update to the Risk Assessment and Parent Handbook which are both available on the school website.

#### Free School Meal Vouchers

Any parent/carer in receipt of Free School Meals should have received a voucher covering the period up to 24<sup>th</sup> July. A further voucher covering the Summer holiday period will be sent out the week commencing 27<sup>th</sup> July 2020.

Please note, all vouchers must be redeemed by 14th August 2020.

# **Safeguarding Cover**

Since the beginning of the Coronavirus outbreak, we have provided 24 hour safeguarding cover to support parents/carers. Unfortunately, it will not be possible for us to continue to provide this cover over the summer break. This service will not be available from Wednesday 22nd July.

#### Curriculum

COVID-19 impacted on the launch of our new curriculum pathways which we have had to defer until the next academic year. In September we will be introducing the Recovery Curriculum which will focus on rebuilding relationships and friendships, addressing pupil/student losses of structure, routine, friendships, freedom and opportunities, including the impact that the pandemic has had on our their mental health and well-being. The curriculum will provide targeted interventions to address skills that have regressed during the



lockdown, such as physical skills, and will also incorporate a personalised transition into the next phase of each pupil/student's learning journey in school. Following the break, we will be sending home more details of this curriculum.
